A2A Pregnancy Resource Services

A2A- Alternatives to Abortion Program Provide a network of services that promote childbirth and supports a woman and her family in the early years of raising a baby.

Goal to improve child health and development by helping parents provide responsible and competent care for their children; to improve families' economic self-sufficiency by helping parents continue their education and find a job.

Focus Area of Services:

A2A Pregnancy Resource Services

Service Area: Gregg, Smith, Upshur, Titus, and Harrison Counties

Eligibility for Services: Texas residents who are pregnant and unsure of whether to have the child. Client services must also assist families and adoptive parents in raising a child and assist individuals who experience a loss of a child. The following are eligibility criteria for client services of A2A:

- The biological father or mother of an **unborn child**; OR
- The biological father or mother of a child up to **3 years post-partum**; OR
- The parents, legal guardians, and Adult Caregivers of a minor who is a program client; OR
- The parents 90 calendar days after miscarriage or loss of a child (counseling, referrals, and other relevant services); OR
- The adoptive parents up to 2 years post adoption finalization, regardless of the age of the child.

PADREs Services

Parenting Awareness and Drug Risk Education Services (PADREs) for at-risk families provides community support for mothers and fathers with substance use disorders; or who are at risk of developing substance use disorders to assist the family to thrive.

GOAL To provide a planned and coordinated educational approach to decrease the effects of substance use within the family and to increase access to community resources and evidenced-based education.

● Substance Misuse • ATOD • Self-Esteem • strengthening families • parenting skills • positive youth development • child abuse prevention • child neglect prevention • child and adolescent development • linkage to community supportive



Case Coordination Services

- Assist with short term crisis related to shelter; food; housing

- Coordinate Transportation for medical appointments; court
- One-on-One Support
- Assist with baby food; diapers; baby clothes



Parenting Education Services

- One-on-one and group parenting sessions

PADREs Services Continued

Eligibility for Services:

- Parents including single mothers **OR** fathers who are Texas residents with a child up to 6 years old.
- Expectant parents who have one or more risk factors for a substance use disorder as identified in the PADREs Screening.
- Expectant parents and/or parents who are concurrently admitted to substance use disorder treatment programs.
- Open CPS case or Family Court
- Experiencing homelessness; domestic violence; mental health issues;

Service Area: Services are provided in *Gregg, Smith, Harrison, Upshur, Marion, Rusk, Wood, Anderson, Panola, Van Zandt, and Henderson Counties.*

Parenting Awareness and Drug Risk Education Services (**PADRES**) provides community-based intervention outreach services and education to people who are childbearing age to decrease the impact of substance use.

Services/Intervention include:

- Talking with the parents about their needs and their children's needs.
- Parental education classes.
- Home Visits
- Assistance with transportation
- Recommending community services that can assist parents and their children.
- Outreach activities
- Pregnancy tests
- Helping parents get needed services and supplies.
- Parenting education. Topics Include:
 - Tobacco Cessation
 - Risk reduction
 - Infant and/or child safety guidelines
 - Fetal and/or child development
 - Family Violence and safety planning
 - Pregnancy and reproductive health
 - Substance exposed pregnancy education
 - Communicable Disease

Substance Abuse Prevention Services – Positive Action

Substance Abuse Prevention Youth Prevention Selective (Positive Action) - Selective prevention programs promote a proactive process to address and promote the health and wellness of individuals, families, and communities by enhancing protective factors and by averting factors that place an individual at risk for substance abuse. This program type is designed to target individuals whose risk of developing a substance use or abuse disorder is significantly higher than average. **Positive Action** School and Community Based evidence-based curricula.

Eligibility for services:

- Academic failure
- Suspected alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs misuse
- Truancy
- Suspected juvenile delinquency

Parents, grandparents, guardians, and siblings of the youth are also eligible to participate in program services.

Substance Abuse Prevention Services – Strengthening Families

Youth Prevention Indicated (Strengthening Families) - Services that promote a proactive process to address health and wellness for youth, families, and communities by enhancing protective factors that increase knowledge, skills, and attitudes for making healthy choices.

PURPOSE Family-Focused program aimed to engage the family unit. To increase protective factors and reduce risk factors that lead to both substance use and youth depression. The program is designed to have both parents and child to practice skills that involve bonding; setting boundaries; and monitoring their child's emotional well-being and activities to support them to thrive at school and home.

School Sites and Community Site Services

- Strengthening Families curriculum to provides education on alcohol, tobacco and other drugs for **seven to 14 weeks** in local schools for youth ages 6 and up.
- Education Presentations on substance use/misuse



Services

- **Parenting/Family Sessions** Use of Strengthening Families curriculum to provide parenting education on alcohol, tobacco and other drugs for **14 weeks** in local schools for youth ages 6 and up. Each weekly session is (2) hours and parents/guardians must participate in weekly sessions. Topics include communication with love; positive discipline; stress & anger management skills; successful parenting. Families are feed a meal during the weekly sessions.
- **Information Dissemination** to communicate positive messages via informational materials or media (social media; billboards; PSAs)
- **Postive Alternatives (Actviities)** These alcohol and drug-free activities are provided with the intent to help people, particularly young people, stay away from situations that encourage use of alcohol, tobacco or other drugs.
- **Referrals** To supportive community resources based on expressed need.

Substance Abuse Services Continued- Strengthening Families

Eligibility for services:

- **Youth ages 6 to 18** or Kindergarten to 12th grade. **10 thru 18** (or youth up to age 18) that may be experience the following:
 - o Signs of substance use and misuse
 - o Shows early signs of substance use and misuse
 - o Juvenile delinquency
 - o Open case with child protective services
 - o Family discord
 - o Poor parent/child engagement and/or communication
- **Parents, grandparents, guardians, and siblings** of youth participants

Texas Home Visiting Services –Nurse Family Partnership

Texas Home Visiting Program -Maternal Infant Early Childhood Home Visiting (MIECHV) is a federal grant that supports a program of three-tiered research-based home visiting services. They are Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP); **and/or** Parents as Teachers (PAT); **and/or** Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY).

Purpose - Texas Home Visiting grant program is to support and enhance maternal child health, parent child attachment, child development, child safety, family stability, and school readiness in eligible communities. The Texas Home Visiting grant program seeks to improve maternal child health, parent child attachment, child development, child safety, family stability, and school readiness. Wellness Pointe site offers the following (3) programs that a family may enroll based on their family needs:

- (1) Nurse-Family Partnership (NFP)
- (2) Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY)
- (3) Parents As Teachers (PAT)* subcontractor

Focus AreasFocus Area:

- Maternal and Child Health • Prenatal Care • Home Visits • Child Development •Parenting
- School Readiness



Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) Services

- Focuses on first-time, low-income mothers
- Promotes and teaches positive health and development behaviors between a mother and her baby.
- Registered Professional *Licensed Nurses* providing one-on-one home visits that are designed to improve prenatal and maternal health and birth outcomes; child health and development.
- Visits can begin before the 28th week of gestation and when the woman's child turns 2 years of age.



Home Services

- Weekly scheduled one-on-one home visits with RN
- Educational support(Parenting; child development; prenatal care; post partum depression; child immunization; domestic violence; proper infant care; breastfeeding)
- Prevention of Child Abuse with stress management techniques



Referrals

- Provide referrals to other community resources – medical referrals for mother and child • mental health counseling • legal counsel • housing •support groups • child welfare and family services.

Nurse Family Partnership Continued

Eligibility for Services:

NFP – Requires mom to be pregnant with *1st child and within 28 weeks of pregnancy.*

Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) Services

- HIPPY is a highly structured school readiness program designed to empower parents as their child's first teacher and prepare them for early success in school and Developmentally appropriate.
- Focuses on letter recognition; phonological awareness; language development; problem-solving; and cognition-based.



Home Services

- Weekly scheduled one-on-one home visits with HIPPY Home Visitors
- Weekly home visits and monthly group meetings
- Role play as method of instruction
- Family Celebrations and fun activities
- Prevention of Child Abuse with stress management techniques



Referrals

- Provide referrals to other community resources – medical referrals for mother and child; mental health counseling; legal counsel; housing; support groups; and child welfare and family services.

Eligibility for Services:

- **HIPPY** – Must have child age 3 to 5 years of age. **Parents with children ages 3 through 4**
**(Must be required age on or before the new cycle of September 1st)*

Parents As Teachers (PAT) Services

WIC Services

WIC- Women, Infants, & Children Programming- WIC safeguard the health of low-income women, infants, and children up to age 5 who are at nutritional risk by providing nutritious foods to supplement diets, nutrition education (including breastfeeding promotion and support), and referrals to health and other social services helps women and children to have access to healthy foods.

WIC Purpose: To provide supplemental food benefits, nutrition education, and counseling to enhance good health care at no cost to low-income pregnant and postpartum women, infants, and children identified to be a nutritional risk.

Focus Areas: • Maternal and Child Health • Supplemental Nutrition • nutrition education • referrals to community resources • food insecurity • baby formula.



Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) Services

- The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children is a federal assistance program of the Food and Nutrition Service of the United States Department of Agriculture for healthcare and nutrition of low-income pregnant women, breastfeeding women, and children under the age of five.



WIC Services

- WIC helps to buy many of the healthy foods.
- The WIC foods on monthly food package are low in fat, high in fiber to help get important nutrients, and promote a healthy weight.

- Breastfeeding Women
- Infants
- Families with children younger than 5 years old
- Women who had a baby within the last six months
- Parents, step-parents, guardians, and foster parents of infants and children who are younger than 5

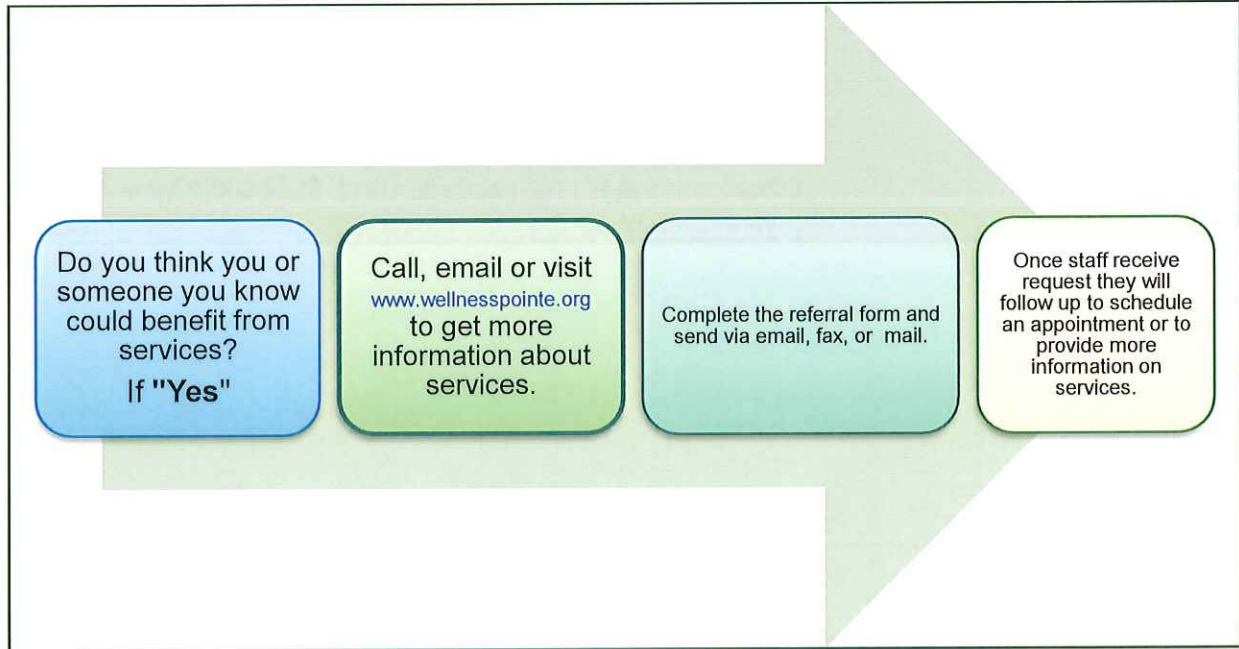
